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### **“March for Men” at a’Mews Restaurant, Glebe**

***Throughout March, a’Mews Restaurant, Glebe will donate a percentage of food and wine sales to prostate cancer research***

- a dinner party in your own home - for you and up to nine of your friends! A feast designed, prepared and served by acclaimed chef and owner of a’Mews, Richard Moyser.

Mr Andrew Giles, Chief Executive of the PCFA says the fight against prostate cancer is an urgent one, and applauds a’Mews Restaurant for its efforts, adding, “This is a great opportunity for lovers of fine food to help fight prostate cancer.

“The fact is, there are 12,000 cases of prostate cancer diagnosed in Australia each year. Tragically, more than 2,700 Australian men die from prostate cancer each year – around the same number of Australian women who sadly lose their life to breast cancer.

“In the early stages, there are few symptoms of prostate cancer. However, if detected early, prostate cancer is often treatable and curable.

“This is why men aged 50 and over should not wait for symptoms. Talking to your GP about prostate cancer NOW is a simple step that could save your life,” said Mr Giles.
